Executive Directors Message of the week:

Good Morning Everyone!

It has been a rough week from the Coronavirus perspective, from those that I have heard from, Jicarilla and Mescalero are going back on lockdown, and Navajo is extending their office closures as well. Everyone stay safe, and take care of yourselves.

Despite all that, work goes on, and Mescalero has been working on getting their pipelines in working order – gotta keep that water flowing! However, we have no solid dates for when fish deliveries might start again, and there is a limited supply after some of the mortality events that occurred over the last year or so. Here in Albuquerque, the monsoons have arrived and are bringing some wonderful moisture to the region. I know that in some areas, former burn scars are creating some serious issues for the summer rains. We feel for you as well.

From a fisheries and natural resources perspective though – there are lots of new opportunities and actions. The Great American Outdoors Act has moved to the next level with the Senate amendments passing the house. WRDA is up for reauthorization. The Tribal Wildlife Corridors Act – part of the larger Wildlife Corridors Conservation Act is up for debate in the Senate this week – we submitted a letter of support!

The AFS is working on having better indigenous participation — I, and they, would love to hear your thoughts on the barriers that might be holding you back — is it the membership fee? Conference fees? Is the atmosphere non-welcoming? Please share your thoughts will me and I will make sure they make it up to those that need to hear it! We would love to have good stories to support our advocacy for the inclusion of our member tribes and others in natural resource management discussions and decisions.

1. 2020 Low-Tech Process Based Restoration of Riverscapes Virtual Workshop

This virtual workshop will introduce conservationists to 'low-tech' process-based approaches for restoring streams and their associated riparian areas (riverscapes) to benefit fish, wildlife, and working lands. Participants will learn principles guiding low-tech process-based restoration and become familiar with simple, hand-built tools, including Beaver Dam Analogues (BDAs) and Post-Assisted Log Structures (PALS), intended to mimic and promote specific ecosystem processes. Participants will gain basic skills in the planning, design, and implementation phases of project development. Course content is supported by a published Design Manual.
