- 2. <u>Desert Fish Habitat Partnership</u> Deadline to apply has been extended to October 9, 2020!
- 3. **U.S. Fish and Wildlife QZAP FY2020** funding. The total funding amount for projects is approximately \$1,830,000.00 with expanded categories and priorities of potential projects. There is a significant change in the application process this year resulting from our transition to <u>GrantSolutions.gov</u>. This opportunity will be open for application through October 18, 2020. Reclamation's Native American Affairs Technical Assistance Program is making up to \$1 million available in Fiscal Year 2021 for tribes and tribal organizations in the western United States to develop, manage, and protect tribal water and related resources.
