- 2. U.S. Fish and Wildlife QZAP FY2020 funding. The total funding amount for projects is approximately \$1,830,000.00 with expanded categories and priorities of potential projects. There is a significant change in the application process this year resulting from our transition to <u>GrantSolutions.gov</u>. This opportunity will be open for application through October 18, 2020.
